










ELEMENTARY DESIGN




Middle Schools students prefer bright, medium colors in cool tones. Greens, teals and blues are favored with orange accents.

It is important to incorporate a full spectrum of colors in the design of these environments. Darker, more saturated colors may be used in spaces, as accents, for interest and variety.

School colors also begin to play an important role in the design of the Middle School. They create a positive social climate providing a sense of caring and guidance.

- Children 13 14 preferred blue, ultramarine and orange






MIDDLE SCHOOL DESIGN

- Use fresh blues and sage greens
- Use trendy or saturated colors as accents

HISTORIC RESTORATION

- Colleges and universities are investing in their historic landmarks and working to preserve the legacy of their campuses.
- Non-profit organizations are aiding this historic preservation through grants like the HBCU Cultural Heritage Stewardship Initiative by the National Trust for Historic Preservation.
- Even small details contribute to the history of a building and can be returned to their original glory
- A great example is the Founders and Green Hall restoration project at Wellesley College by EYP. The iconic doors from 1921 were brought back to life through meticulous restoration and expert fabrication.

SUNDRENCHED AREAS

Where there is great sun during many days, warm colors of yellow and orange may be too hot and invigorating to use in abundance.

NORTHERN REGIONS

Where much of the school year is cold and gray, consider minimal use of neutral tones and increase color usage, especially warm hues.

WESTERN TERRITORIES

Brighter accents and color variety may be preferred in these areas that accept a more novel and contemporary approach to design.

EASTERN COASTLINES


More traditional and muted colors may be preferred in time-honored color ranges where a more conservative approach is held in high regard.




FULL SPECTRUM LIGHTING

- Profoundly effect of our health and moods and perception of color in room is improved
- Decreases hyperactive behavior of students in first grade
- Children in this lighting become more attentive, less aggressive, and less fidgety
- Performance and visual acuity increases as general fatigue decreases
- A variety of lighting or ability to change lighting levels from light to dark will help set the tone for specific spaces and suit natural circadian rhythms. Task areas require higher levels of light; conversely, lower levels offer a place for the eye to rest.

NATURAL LIGHTING

- Melatonin cycles in children are disrupted when deprived of natural light, which reduces alertness during school
- Low light levels in classrooms affected students' ability to regulate the body's natural cycle of sleep and alertness
- Students progressed 20% faster on math tests and 26% faster on reading tests when daylight was designed into the classroom. Those with skylights had an improvement of 19-20%.
- Students and teachers prefer windows. We are now seeing laws enacted from the state level requiring operable windows in new classrooms

NATURAL LIGHTING

Red has many aspects that make it a dramatic and interesting color. It is generally interpreted as warm or hot. Colors from this area of the palette include raspberry, strawberry, cherry, watermelon, rouge, geranium, cranberry, maroon, burgundy, wine, ruby and crimson.

RED SPECTRUM

OBSERVATIONS

In red environments, we experience increased eye blinking, elevated blood pressure, heartbeat and respiration rates, higher energy and excitement. Our sense of smell and the sensitivity to tasting foods also improves.

Weights and time are also affected when surrounded by colors of this spectrum. Elements seem heavier and time seems to slow down when under the influence of red.



Orange has a playful attitude and a gregarious nature. When stronger, this color is exuberant and when subtle it is simply cozy. Warm colors from this area of the palette include melon, clay, salmon, coral, peach, apricot, rust, terra-cotta, shrimp, copper, mango, marigold and cinnamon.

OBSERVATIONS

Orange is an active color. Perfect for a setting that promotes movement and excitement.

It is felt that orange corresponds to circulation and nervous systems and has a tremendous tonic effect. When individuals have a cold they somehow crave the color of orange juice and the nutrient of vitamin C to combat infection. Yellow is a most liberating color. It corresponds to freedom and self-development. Yellow adds light and energy to our lives and is perceived to be a healthful and invigorating color. Warm colors from this area of the palette include ochre, buttercup, gold, almond, lemon, citrus, honey, brass, amber, daisy and sunshine.

OBSERVATIONS

"After white, yellow is the color that most strongly reflects the light hitting it. It always triggers a light, free, open feeling... a liberating, loosening effect. Therefore it corresponds to a definite sense of freedom and self-development." - Dr. Max Luscher.

Yellows feel particularly healthful. The presence of iron and vitamins A and C are found in yellow fruits which underscore this warm and invigorating palette.



Greens are visually the most restful color. Some greens which are more yellow may be considered warmer, while greens which are cooler will be more on the blue side of the spectrum. Colors from this area of the palette include sage, moss, lime, mint, hunter, celadon, olive, evergreen, leaf, emerald, fern, avocado, grass, spruce, clover and holly.

OBSERVATIONS

Green has both negative and positive associations. It is the color of decay and of rebirth.

Light greens provide a soothing and sheltered atmosphere while the medium greens are healing and abound in nature. The deepest of the greens bring us balance, harmony and renewal. This color is ultimately calming and captivating. It carries the essence of nature from green, the spiritual qualities of blue. Combined it is a most thoughtful and endearing color. Cool colors from this area of the palette include robin's egg, teal, blue-green, aqua, turquoise, sea foam, jade and peacock.

OBSERVATIONS

Ancient Persians trusted this lively blue to ward off the evil eye, protecting their animals as well as themselves with turquoise charms. The name teal is from 1917, taken from the small freshwater Common Teal.

Luscher's theory says this color is an expression of firmness, constancy and resistance to change. The person who places teal high on his color preference considers possessions as symbols of security and self-esteem.



Blue is a serene color. We can count on this color to free our minds and offer harmonious and peaceful surroundings. Colors from this area of the palette include azure, delft, sky, denim, Wedgwood, blueberry, royal, periwinkle, cobalt, ultramarine and navy.

OBSERVATIONS

Blue is infinite in our world. It is the color of our sky and at the horizon, with the ocean below, it sometimes becomes one unified body of color.

Interestingly, as altitude increases so do the number of violet and blue flowers.

Violet is an inspirational color. It brings us the passion of red and the spirituality of blue, combined in an irresistible color that brings magic to our environments. Colors from this area of the palette include iris, amethyst, lilac, orchid, purple, lavender, plum, grape, violet, eggplant and blackberry.

We consider them expensive and rare, the color of royalty.



Warm Neutrals are considered to be the hardest working color family, making us feel protected by their presence. Colors from this area of the palette include khaki, oatmeal, bisque, chocolate, tea, desert, toast, mahogany, cream, straw, vanilla, off-white, tan, taupe, beige, ivory, oyster, pearl, sand, bronze and brown.

Light warm neutrals are the super hero in the world of design. Medium warm neutrals are timeless in their appeal.

Dark neutrals have a masculine and rustic appearance about them.

Cool neutrals provide room for introspection and impart the essence of stillness, with a reserved and sometimes serious attitude. Colors from this area of the palette include fog, ebony, stainless, pewter, smoke, ash, chrome, white, frost, grey, charcoal, slate, graphite, onyx, silver and stone.
