2023 STORM WATCH

Hurricane researchers from Colorado State University are predicting a slightly below-average Atlantic hurricane season for 2023, with the likely development of El Niño as the primary factor. Tropical and subtropical conditions in the Atlantic are warmer than usual, creating a strong uncertainty regarding the strength of El Niño, should it form this year.
